1 Week	Your team are introduced to being in Another Kind of School, to the DRH Pedagogy and the Development Instructor (DI) Concept. You are organised in Trios, get introduced to areas of running the school, and with great appetite take your part. Experience common life at the school.

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PERIOD 2	THE CONTEMPORARY WORLD
2 ½ Weeks	Your team is introduced to Historical Materialism and dig into the driving forces of development in the world today and the gap between the rich and the poor. Putting up questions and statements – then studying and debating to find answers. You prepare and carry out a 4 day biking/hitch hiking investigation based on your hypotheses, to dig deeper into specific big issues of our times.

PERIOD 3	THE STEWARDS OF TOMORROW
2 Weeks	In this period your team studies the risks that our way of life today presents to our planet and people of the future. Studies about natural science, global warming, climate change and how industrial agriculture directly contributes to the destruction of the environment. You are introduced to the concept of Open Future and discuss how humankind can use human, natural and material resources and potentials to strive for a future that embraces the next generations.

PERIOD 4	EUROPE'S LEGACY
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1½ Week	The main content of this week is to study the development of Europe in the past and contemporary world. You learn about the role of Europe in Africa and South America and how this established influence and the foundation of the riches for European nation states. Dig into questions of race and identity in European nation states and Europe as a whole, and how this has influenced divisions with regards to class, gender and economic disparities. Prepare investigations you will carry out during the travel.

PERIOD 5	 Digging deeper into the Cross Book SPECIALISIATION AND PREPARATION FOR THE BUS TRAVEL
2 Weeks	During this period you build on the knowledge and skills gained so far and you prepare for the action period. Studies continue about planet protection and other contemporary world themes that fit to the environment project where your team will work during the action period. You meet the partner responsible for the project in the action period (probably on zoom or Skype) to learn more about the philosophy and ethics, the daily life, the challenges, obstacles and the victories of the project. You also continue preparing for the bus travel.

PERIOD X	COMMON OR LOCAL HIGHLIGHT
1 Week	Your team join one of the highlights of their period by either taking part in a 1-week Preparation Camp to organise a big event with other activists, or to organise a special event at CICD. This period will be placed at different times in the programme dependent upon when the common or local highlight takes place
Main themes and content	The highlight could include one of the following events:



PERIOD 7	ACTION PERIOD AT THE ENVIRONMENT PROJECT

8 Weeks	Your team arrive well at the project, being welcomed and acclimatising to become able and ready for the main tasks at the project. After 2 weeks, you set up goals for the last 6 weeks based on the main activities of the project as presented by the Project Manager. Together you organise an event, as a thank you and final contribution to the people at the project.
Main themes and content	 Introduction working period of 2 weeks - getting to know project staff and the work Defining specific goals for last 6 weeks with the Project Manager and teacher Start up with the work as an action volunteer Getting into the routines of the work Weekly meetings in the team and sending weekly reports to the school Weekly preparation of quality materials for the Bringing It to the Public period Follow up on appointments for the Bringing It to the Public period Monthly reports and Skype meetings with the principal at CICD Organise an event at the project

PERIOD 8	BRINGING IT TO THE PUBLIC
4 Weeks	Finding a quiet location close to the project, your team make a session to conclude on the action period. The principal joins for final conclusions and to be part of qualifying the Bringing It the Public period and how you will spread the vision of CREATING CHANGE on the way back to CICD. The message about protecting our planet is brought to people with creative methods. Discussions about your next steps, and about the meaning of Open Future, are also taking place.
