PERIOD 1	INTRODUCTION TO ANOTHER KIND OF SCHOOL
1 Week	You learn about CICD as Another Kind of School, our Pedagogy and are introduced to the Climate Activist programme. You get to know all the facilities of our college including the garden farm, park and gym. You are introduced to the areas of running the school, go for it with great appetite, and experience the lively and busy common life at the school.

PERIOD 2	GAIA WARNS US
2 Weeks	One of the greatest issues of our time is climate change. It poses a risk to the health of our planet. It affects the world's population by deepening the inequalities and injustices that already exist. During this period, you and your teammates will study, investigate and debate what is happening globally and what we can do, locally. Climate change affects us all, and we need to be equipped with the knowledge and tools needed to take action.

Main themes	\Box What is the Gaia theory?
& conten	 Global Warming and Climate Change is for real! It is happening! The IPCC Report on Global Warming. The 9 Planetary Boundaries. Climate Change contributors. Greenhouse gases – food miles – climate maths – extinction. Investigation and visit to renewable energy producers. Garden Farming is common sense. Togetherness as the system of all systems. Practical actions in the organic gardenfarm. People's Exam. Focus on 250 learning elements. Open Weekend.
PERIOD 3	MAN AND NATURE IN HOT EMBRACE
3 Weeks	In this 3-week period, we will start with a course about two ways of understanding history and discuss how we can use it in our program. Then we go on to reading and planning the period. In this period, you will dig into some major contributors and consequences of Global Warming and Climate Change and the relation between man and nature. You will investigate work for sustainability that's happening the northern part of England. You will also make a one-week action at CICD under the headline "consumerism" preparing and giving presentations to many people.

Main themes content	 Man as master or part of nature. Historical Materialism. The effects of industrial farming. Global militarism and climate change. Ecological farming – can the soil save us? Melting Greenland – what are the ramifications? Climate refugees. People's Exam

3 Weeks	In this 3-week period, you will dig into global warming impacts around the world. You will learn about the history and situation in the Caribbean and understand what the Climate Compliance Conference is and which climate emergencies they are facing. You will debate what climate justice could look like. You will study environmental movements fighting for change around the world and debate the consent of fighting FOR. You will also learn about how Humana People to People work to mitigate Global Warming and Climate Change with The Poor.

4 Weeks	This 4-week period is all about getting ready and well prepared for going to St. Vincent, and for the last period "Bringing It to The Public". You meet with the headmaster and project leaders from RVA dig deeper into the Climate Compliance Conference, get job descriptions, and train the relevant project skills. As a team, you make a solid contribution to the organic garden farm at CICD. You prepare and implement an action in the community.
PERIOD 5	PROJECT SPECIALISATION
Main themes & content	 Mapping out global warming impacts around the world. Climate Justice. The concept of fighting FOR (and not just AGAINST). Climate Activism. Five centuries of exploitation in the Caribbean. St Vincent and the Grenadines today. The Climate Compliance Conference at Richmond Vale Academy. Activities and results in the Climate Compliance Conference. The Humana People to People world and how their projects work to mitigate Global Warming and Climate Change. The real cause of world hunger. Hurricanes and climate emergencies in the Caribbean. Coral reefs - the forest of the sea. Visit and contribute to local initiatives. Environmental movements fighting for change around the world. 250 learning elements - summing up progress. Midway meeting. People's Exam. Open Weekend.

Main themes & content	 Digging deeper into RVA's Climate Compliance. Conference. Skype meeting headmaster and project leaders from RVA. Getting job descriptions. Training project skills. Make a solid contribution to CICD-s organic Garden Farm Community Action. What does it take to stay healthy? Stewards of tomorrow. Plan and prepare "Bringing It to the Public period. Signing contracts for the Service Period and making practical preparations. Open Future II. It's ShowTime. Open Weekend.
PERIOD 6	HITTING THE GROUND RUNNING
2 Weeks	Arriving in St. Vincent the first 2 weeks is called "Hitting the ground running". This short period is all about arriving well, being welcomed, and quickly acclimatising to become able and ready for the 11 week long period 7 of fighting global warming and climate change with The Poor.
Main themes & content	 Arriving in St Vincent. Meeting the Climate Compliance Conference. Getting to know the activities at RVA's Climate Center. Quickly getting into daily routines, chores, sports and fun Carry out actions in the school garden farm. Interviewing 35 families – understand the realities for The Poor. Planning the rest of the period.
Period 7	FIGHTING GLOBAL WARMING AND CLIMATE CHANGE WITH THE POOR

11 weeks	In this 11-week period, FIGHTING WITH THE POOR is what it is all about. You must use your combined and collective forces and then some more to reach everything that was planned for, including getting ready to talk about it afterwards. The period is about creating CHANGE that lasts and doing it together with The Poor.
Period 8	OUR LEGACY
4 weeks	In this 4-week period you are coming back to CICD. You must find the best ways to spread the vision of creating CHANGE as well as the know-how about practical ways and means. Future teams of climate activists must be mobilised, and the message must be brought to people everywhere that fighting global warming and climate change with The Poor is possible, is needed, and is happening now.
Main themes & content	 Debate experiences & understanding about what it takes to make change. Prepare presentations. Bringing It to the Public – reaching several thousand people with lively presentations and discussions on the urgent task we as humanity face in fighting off global warming and climate change and mitigating the consequences for those hit the hardest. Handing over photos, films, illustrations, action plans and other products to CICD Discussing own plans for the future. Ending the program with a Big Bang event. Saying goodbye. Stepping into Open Future.
